Finish Strong:

Religious Identity & Mission:

Advent:

We are very excited about the season of Advent and the many meaningful messages that can be used about our faith and how it relates to our everyday lives. Classes are enjoying learning about this special time in our liturgical year with creating the Advent wreath and Advent Calendar.

Advent wreaths:

Traditionally the Advent wreath has 5 candles; three purple, one pink and one white in the middle.

On the first Sunday of Advent the first purple candle on the Advent Wreath will be lit. This candle is called the "Prophecy Candle" and represents hope or expectation in anticipation of the coming Messiah.

On the second Sunday of Advent, the second purple candle is lit. This candle represents love and is called the "Bethlehem Candle,".

On the third Sunday of Advent the pink candle is lit. This is called the "Shepherd's Candle" and it represents joy.

On the fourth Sunday the last purple candle, called the "Angels Candle," is lit. This candle represents peace.

On Christmas Eve, the white centre candle is lit. This candle is called the "Christ Candle".



Parish Mass:

Mrs Hayes' Year 3/4 class led our Parish Mass at the church today. It was a beautiful mass followed by a lovely morning tea back at school. Please note that the assessment is not a measure of a child's faith nor their participation in the broader life of the Catholic community.
