#### End Of Term 3 Reading and Learning Journal Report:

As mentioned, many times, we have a specific focus on Reading, that is included in our Home Learning expectations. Research has also shown that parental engagement promotes better student outcomes. At St Joseph's we are strongly encouraging parents to be connected with the Home Learning. It is expected that you check and sign your child's Journal every night, recording how long your child has read. We have been keeping a record of the number of nights all students have read, with the aim being to increase student reading across the whole school.

As we complete another term of learning, we are reporting how this is going. Across the school we have seen many students becoming more engaged with reading both in class, as well as at home through their Reading & Learning Journals. Your child will receive an letter about how your child is tracking. This information has been collated from their Reading & Learning Journal.

I understand that encouraging children to read can sometimes be a challenge at home but I truly appreciate and thank parents/carers for their ongoing support, commitment and responsibility with this important structure.
